I thought it would be good to remind you where the funds donated to our poor boxes help. The 1st Sunday goes to Food Pantry operations (to assist covering the ongoing expense of running the program, especially in the procuring and providing of food). The 3rd Sunday goes to the Hill Fund (to assist parishioners and non-parishioners with momentary housing challenges, such as helping with a month or two of rent/mortgage, utility bill or medical bill in case of loss of job, health challenges or other unforeseen circumstances). For the other Sundays, the poor box funds help other ways our parish helps the poor, including annual help we give to places like Project Echo, Calvert Hospice, individual needs of the poor that come to our doors, etc. We are also blessed to have Catholic Charities' Parish Partners and Community Ministry of Calvert County programs here on our campus. Both of these entities provide invaluable help to people in need and they also assist our parish in the evaluation process of people in need. We all work hard to help who we can, as well as validate the needs to be sure we are always using the money wisely and making the biggest impact. Thank you for the many ways all of you as parishioners help us in helping others!

On Thursday, June 28th the Church celebrates the Bishop and Martyr St. Irenaeus. He was born at Smyrna in the year 130. He was a disciple of St Polycarp and became bishop of Smyrna. He was a priest at Lyons in France at the time of the persecution there, and became bishop of the city when the previous bishop was martyred. He is known as a theologian and a powerful defender of the faith against the heresy of the Gnostics. He is thought to have been martyred about 200. Here is a prayer I wanted to share:

Father, you called Saint Irenaeus to uphold your truth and bring peace to your Church. By his prayers renew in us faith and love that we may always be intent on fostering unity and peace. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.
